(1) Students may use no more than *two* of the following courses for the Economics major: 220:300, 220:335, and 220:336.

(2) Econ of Globalization (220:307) also has a prerequisite of 220:300 or 220:335 or 220:336.

(3) Students who have credit for 220:304 offered Fall 2010 may not get degree or major credit for 220:364.

(4) 220:405, 406, and 407 have prerequisites of 220:320, Statistics, and Calculus II.

## NOTES:

### To declare major

- Take 220:102 (*Intro to Micro*), 220:103 (*Intro to Macro*) and 640:135 (*Calculus I*)
- Receive a grade of C or better in all three of the above courses.
- Log onto MyMajor.SAS.Rutgers.edu and select Economics as your first or second major.
- Come to New Jersey Hall, Room 202 anytime during normal business hours to complete the declaration process.

### To graduate with economics major

- Grade of C or better in *Intro to Microeconomics* (220:102), *Intro to Macroeconomics* (220:103), *Calculus I* (640:135, 640:151, or equivalent), *Statistics* (960:285, 960:211, or equivalent), *Intermediate Microeconomics* (203/320), and *Intermediate Macroeconomics* (204/321)
- Grade of C or better in *Econometrics* (220:322) for all students declaring after July 1, 2009 and enrolling in *Econometrics* Fall 2009 semester or later. (Students who received a grade of D in *Econometrics* prior to Fall 2009 may use it towards the major; that D, however, counts as the one D that can be counted toward the major.)
- Credit for seven electives in economics; at least four of these must be “upper-level” electives. See the front of this sheet for lists of the lower- and upper-level elective courses in economics.
- Starting in Spring 2010, *Managerial Economics* (220:308) will no longer be counted toward the major. However, students who took *Managerial Economics* (220:308) before Spring 2010 will be allowed to use the course as a lower-level elective towards the major.
- Students may use no more than two of the following courses for the Economics major: *International Economics* (220:300), *International Trade* (220:335), and *International Balance of Payments* (220:336).
- A limit of one grade of D may be counted toward the major.
- A minimum GPA of 2.0 in your economics classes is required. Calculus and Statistics do not count in the determination of your economics GPA.
- A maximum of three approved classes taken outside the RU-New Brunswick Economics Department can be counted toward the major

### To graduate with economics minor

- Grade of C or better in 220:102 (*Intro to Microeconomics*), 220:103 (*Intro to Macroeconomics*),
- For the remaining four courses that count toward the economics minor, a limit of one grade of D may count toward the minor.
- *Managerial Economics* (220:308) may be used as elective for the minor.
- Starting Fall 2010, students may only use **one** of the following two courses towards the Economics minor: *Managerial Economics* (01:220:308) and *Engineering Economics* (14:540:343).
- A maximum of two approved classes taken outside the RU-New Brunswick Economics Department can be counted toward the minor

### Accounting Classes

- *Intro to Financial Accounting* (010:272) and *Intro to Managerial Accounting* (010:275) may be used as lower-level electives for the Economics major. However, they are counted as classes taken outside the RU-New Brunswick Economics Department.
